# **Enhancement Measures**of the Maritime and Aviation Training Fund

Thank you for the support of Hong Kong Shipowners Association for the nurturing of maritime talents, in particular sea-going officers, for Hong Kong over the past years. We are pleased to inform you that the Government has implemented enhancement measures for three subsidy schemes under the Maritime and Aviation Training Fund ("MATF") on 1 December 2023, to sustain our concerted efforts in attracting and retaining maritime manpower. The three enhanced schemes are namely Sea-going Training Incentive Scheme ("SGTIS"), Local Vessel Competency Enhancement Scheme ("LVCES"), and Ship Repair Training Incentive Scheme ("SRTIS").

The primary objective of SGTIS is to encourage local young individuals to pursue and complete sea-going training, thereby fostering their future careers in maritime support industries. Since April 2014, the Scheme had been offering full reimbursement of the Deck Officer or Marine Engineer Officer Class 3 examination fee and a monthly subsidy of \$6,000 to deck and engineer cadets on sea-going vessels, maximum for 18 and 12 months respectively (Phase 1). Moreover, a monthly subsidy of \$3,000 for a maximum period of 6 months would also be provided to deck and engineer cadets who are preparing for the Certificate of Competency ("CoC") Class 3 examination ashore after completion of cadetship (Phase 2) while a monthly subsidy of \$6,000 for a maximum period of 6 months would be offered to those who return to sea-going vessels after having obtained the CoC Class 3 but are awaited to be promoted to officer rank (Phase 3).

In the endeavor to strengthen the effectiveness of SGTIS in attracting, retaining and motivating young graduates to take up sea-going training, we have enhanced the Scheme by –

- raising the monthly subsidy under Phase 1 from \$6,000 to \$10,000;
- extending the subsidy period of Phase 2 from 6 months to 9
   months; and
- introducing a new Phase 4 so as to encourage practitioners to pursue higher professional qualifications through the provision of one-off financial incentives of \$40,000 and \$80,000 to those who have passed the examination and obtained Deck Officer or Marine Engineer Officer CoC Class 2 and Class 1 respectively. To attracting these professionals to continuously sail as senior officers onboard, while 30% of the incentive would be disbursed upon the obtaining of CoC, the remaining 70% is payable after they have acquired 12 months of post-qualification sea service.

Enhancement measures have also been taken on LVCES and SRTIS with scheme scope expanded and/or subsidy amounts increased.

All the enhancement measures have no retrospective effect. They apply to applications submitted on or after 1 December 2023 only. Details of the three enhanced schemes have been uploaded to the website of MATF:
